2023 Annual Summary:

In 2023, Prayer Shawls for Families of Servicemembers mailed **915 letters** to family members of 295 fallen servicemembers in 48 states, Guam, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia, inviting them to request Prayer Shawls. In response to requests received, **81 Prayer Shawls** were provided.

Due to a 6 month pause in the distribution of Next-of-Kin lists during a program review, nearly half of the letters were mailed at the end of the year. Prayer Shawls provided in response to requests generated by these letters will be included in the 2024 annual summary.

Additionally, **48 Prayer Shawls** were provided to the **Friends of the Fallen at Dover Air Force Base**, and **26 Prayer Shawls were** given to an **Alabama Veterans Home**
